◆ **Our mission**

The mission of the Graduate School of Human and Environmental Studies, Kyoto University, is to deepen fundamental understanding of humans and nature through interdisciplinary approaches bridging the humanities, social sciences, and natural sciences. While pursuing these research aims, the Graduate School strives to instill professional and technical excellence in students who will be researchers, leaders, and practitioners tackling social and environmental problems through their broad perspectives, advanced knowledge, and insights.

◆ **Three Departments**

• **Department of Human Coexistence**

Scientific progress simultaneously enriches and challenges modern societies, as new technologies entail new human interactions and affect mental and physical wellbeing. The Department of Human Coexistence studies humans not only as individuals, but as coexisting societies and communities. It trains researchers, educators, and professionals to develop flexible responses to social problems.

• **Department of Cultural Coexistence**

Never in history has dialogue been so necessary to ameliorate conflicts among nations, regions, and religions. In this global context, the Department of Cultural Coexistence explores ways of coexistence among different cultures, critically reexamining Western civilization and comparing it with others. It trains researchers, educators, and professionals to tackle problems of civilizations using perspectives of history, society, and culture.

• **Department of Interdisciplinary Environment**

The future of the world depends on how humans coexist with nature. This requires developing science and technology for this purpose. Our graduate school accepts applicants in the following two categories of the Ph.D. Program (See pp.8-9 for details)

Category A: Standard Ph.D. Program

Category B: Special Ph.D. Program (Program for those who have continued their research for three or more years after completing their master's program and have published research papers which are relevant to the applicants' research fields at our graduate school)

*Note: Applicants must consult with their prospective academic advisors before deciding their application category.

1. The number of students to be admitted

2. Application eligibility

Interested persons that meet one of the following requirements can apply.

- (1) Those who have or will have by March 31, 2018, either a master's degree, a professional degree (master), or a Juris Doctor degree.
- (2) Those who have completed or will have completed by March 31, 2018, a program in a foreign country which is considered to be equivalent to the master's or professional program at Kyoto University.
- (3) Those who have finished a correspondence course offered by a foreign school while residing in Japan, and have completed or will have completed by March 31, 2018, a program which is considered to be equivalent to the master's or professional program at Kyoto University.
- (4) Those who have or will have completed by March 31, 2018, a program (considered to be equivalent to the master's or professional program at Kyoto University) at a foreign educational institution located in Japan. The institution must be officially registered as a graduate school in its home country and specifically designated by the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology of Japan (hereafter referred to as the Minister of Education).
- (5) Those who have completed a program at the United Nations University and have or will have by March 31, 2018, a degree which is considered to be equivalent to a master's degree.
- (6) Those who have completed a program at either a foreign educational institution, a school defined by (4), or the United Nations University, and have passed the qualifying examination specified by the Minister of Education. Applicants must be considered as having an academic ability considered to be equivalent to that of the master degree holders at Kyoto University.
- (7) Those who have been specifically designated by the Minister of Education. [Those who graduated university or completed 16 years of formal education in a foreign country and engaged in research at universities or research institutions for two or more years. Applicants must be considered as having an academic ability equivalent to that of the master's degree holders at our graduate school.]

- (8) Those who have been considered as having an academic ability equivalent to or above that of the holders of a master's degree, a professional degree (master), or a Juris Doctor degree, and will become 24 years old by March 31, 2018.

Note: Those who would apply under the (6), (7), (8) eligibility requirements must obtain necessary application forms by December 8 (Fri), 2017 and submit the application documents together with the relevant certificates by registered mail. (Application documents must be received by our graduate school no later than December 15 (Fri), 2017, 5 pm.)

3. Application forms and documents

The following forms and documents must be put into a designated light green envelope (can be obtained either by mail or at the Admissions Office counter), and then this envelope must be put into a larger envelope or a package together with the required thesis and its abstract (and relevant papers if necessary. See (8) below.). The larger envelope or the package must be sent to the Admissions Office by registered mail.

- (1) Application form: Use a designated 4-page form. Read thoroughly before filling in.
- (2) Photo card and examination card: Prepare 2 photos (3 cm x 2.4 cm each) showing the upper part of your body, face forward, without a hat. Both photos must have been taken within 3 months of application. Affix each photo on the photo card and the examination card.
- (3) Certificate of completion (or expected completion) of a relevant program and transcript: Documents must be issued under the name of the applicant's university president or the graduate school's dean. (In case of a foreign university, a photocopy of the certificate is acceptable.)
- (4) Mailing address label: The applicant's name, mailing address, postal code must be written on the designated mailing label.
- (5) Entrance examination fee certificate: 30,000 yen must be transferred between December 18 (Mon), 2017 and January 9 (Tue), 2018. (January 9 postmark is valid.)

Applicants who are expected to complete one of the master's programs at Kyoto University other than our graduate school and the Japanese Government Scholarship students (hereafter referred to as the MEXT students) will be exempted from paying the entrance examination fee.

(How to transfer an examination fee.)

- ①. Fill in the designated form and pay at a bank teller (except Japan Post Banks and post offices). Fees cannot be paid by ATMs or online.
- ②. If paid at Mitsui Sumitomo Bank (both branches and the main office), no transfer fee will be charged. If paid at other banks, a transfer fee must be paid by the applicant.
- ③. Obtain the Entrance Examination Fee Payment Certificate and the Entrance Examination Fee Payment Receipt (make sure stamps are put on both certificates), affix the left half of the Entrance Examination Fee Payment Certificate onto the designated form. The right half must be kept by the applicant.

Note: If you have paid the examination fee but did not apply, or if you have paid the examination fee twice by mistake, please contact the Admissions Office (contact information can be found on the last page of this brochure).

- (6) Envelope for mailing the entrance examination card: Write your postal code, mailing address, and name on the designated envelope and affix a 372-yen stamp.
- (7) International applicants: Include the following in addition to (1) through (6).
- ①. CV (Use the designated form.)
 - ②. If you are living in Japan, either a certificate of residence or a photocopy of your resident card (both sides); if you are living outside Japan, a photocopy of your passport (the photo page and the page showing your approved period of stay).
- (8) Master's thesis
- I. Category A applicant: The applicant's master's thesis or equivalent paper (photocopy is acceptable) and its abstract (about 4,000 characters in Japanese), three copies each.
 - II. Category B applicant: The applicant's master's thesis or equivalent paper (photocopy is acceptable), its abstract (about 4,000 characters in Japanese), and major published papers, three copies each.
- * In both Categories A and B, if the mater's thesis and/or other papers are written in English, add their abstracts in English (ask a prospective advisory professor about the length of the abstracts). If the master's thesis and/or other papers are written in languages other than Japanese and English, add the Japanese translation and their abstracts in Japanese (about 4,000 characters in Japanese). Make three copies each.

4. Application procedure

Application forms and documents must be mailed in an envelope or a package by registered mail only.

5. Application period

Applications must be received by the Admissions Office between January 4 (Thu), 2018 and January 9 (Tue), 2018, 5 pm. Envelopes postmarked on January 7 (Sun) will be accepted after the January 9 deadline.

6. Entrance examination

- (1) Examination method: An oral presentation and an oral examination will be conducted (mainly focusing on the submitted thesis and papers). If necessary, a written examination will be conducted about the specialty field and foreign language. Details will be informed separately.
- (2) Examination date: February 1 (Thu), 2018. The examination starts at 9:30 am.
- (3) Examination site: The main building of the Graduate School of Human and Environmental Studies, Kyoto University (Yoshida-Nihonmatsu-cho, Sakyo-ku, Kyoto).

7. Announcement of the examination results

The results (the examinee numbers only) will be posted on the Graduate School's bulletin board on February 16 (Fri), 2018, around 1 pm. The results will posted on the web site of the Graduate School (<http://www.h.kyoto-u.ac.jp/jinkan>) for a short time, but applicants are recommended to confirm the results with the bulletin board. (Inquiries by phone will not be accepted)

Those who passed the examination will be notified by registered mail around February 21 (Wed), 2018.

8. Fee payment and entrance registration

(1) Entrance fee: 282,000 yen (subject to change).

Those who are expected to complete, in March 2018, their master's programs at one of the graduate schools at Kyoto University other than our graduate school and the MEXT students are exempted from paying the entrance fee.

(2) Tuition: 267,900 yen for the spring semester (A yearly fee 535,800 yen) (subject to change). The spring and the fall semester fees can be paid together.

The Japanese Government Scholarships students are exempted from paying the tuition.

(3) Note: Details of the fee payment and the entrance registration will be mailed to the successful applicant together with the acceptance letter.

9. Employee application

Employees of companies/public offices who wish to apply to our graduate school in accordance with the Government's Guidelines for Graduate Schools, Article 14 Special Terms*, must contact a prospective advisory professor before application.

* Graduate schools need to give special consideration to students who are employees of companies/public offices so that the students' study schedule can fit with their work conditions, commuting tie, etc.

10. Important matters

(1) Application

①. All applicants must contact their prospective advisory professors before application in order to confirm/discuss research theme, necessary papers/theses, and the necessity of a written examination.

②. Application documents, once submitted, cannot be changed for any reason.

(2) Entrance examination

①. Details of the examination (place, schedule, etc.) will be mailed to the applicant (around January 23) together with the entrance examination card.

②. On the entrance examination day (February 1, Thu), the applicants must be in the waiting room 30 minutes prior to the start of the examination.

③. If a written examination is required, the applicants can bring with them, besides the entrance examination card, writing implements (black pencils, mechanical pencils, eraser, pencil sharpener) and a watch/clock (timing function only).

(3) Submitted theses/papers will not be returned.

(4) Entrance procedure

①. The applicants who have taken the examination while being a student of a graduate school (including a research student) need to submit either a Certificate of Completion of the Master's Program or a Certificate of Withdrawal from School (No fixed format. Withdrawal date must be before March 31, 2018).

- ②. Those who enter our graduate school while maintaining their positions at corporations/public offices must submit a letter of agreement about the applicants' entrance to our graduate school. The letter must be issued by the applicants' management.
- (5) The applicants who wish to receive application forms by mail must send a standard return envelope (332mmx 240mm) with his/her mailing address and name and a 400-yen stamp. Write 「博士後期課程編入学生募集要項請求」 in red on the front side.
- (6) The applicants who need special attention at the entrance examination due to any kind of disabilities or other reasons must contact the Admissions Office by December 11 (Mon), 2017.
- (7) The applicants need to remember that, once accepted by the graduate school, minimum Japanese language proficiency is needed to handle administrative matters.

12. Privacy policy

Any information written on the application documents will be handled in accordance with Kyoto University's Rules on the Protection of Personal Information.

- (*2) The dotted lines indicate that these subjects can be completed in one academic year.
- (*3) The doctoral dissertation will be subject to the judgment for a doctoral degree conferred by our graduate school only.
- (*4) The names of the primary and the secondary examiners and their comments need to be presented at the end of the Abstract of the doctoral dissertation. For details of the Abstract, see the Application Guideline for the Research Journal.
- (*5) Those who have finished a master's program at graduate schools other than our graduate school (including foreign graduate schools), or those who are considered to have an equal or higher academic ability are included.
- (*6) Research needs to have been conducted for 3 or more consecutive years.
- (*7) Co-authored published books/chapters can be included as long as the co-author(s) has agreed to do so.
- (*8) Consult with the advisory professor so that the student can earn enough credits while maintaining his/her current job.
- (*9) An integrated thesis is defined as the research paper (written by a single author) which is based on the papers and/or books written before entering the Ph.D. program and which integrates the research results conducted at our graduate school. This integrated paper is regarded as the Ph.D. application dissertation.

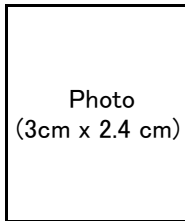

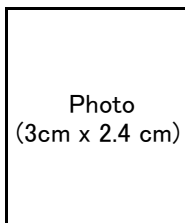
